Syllabus and Scheme of Examination

- Phase 1 - Prelims examination is of objective type.
- Phase 2 - Mains exam is of written type.
- Phase 3 - Interview

PHASE 1 – PRELIMINARY EXAMINATION

The preliminary examination shall be an objective type examination consisting of three papers of **100 Marks** each paper will be of 1 hrs. Each paper shall have 50 questions and each question will be of 2 Marks.

The syllabus for the preliminary examination shall as follows:-

The syllabus for preliminary examination shall be the same as provided for Paper 1 – 3 of Mains examination.

- CIVIL LAW I
- CIVIL LAW II
- CRIMINAL LAW

PHASE 2 – MAINS EXAMINATION

Mains paper shall consist of five paper. Out of which three will be of Law and other two for Language i.e. English and Hindi

PAPER I - CIVIL LAW I

(200 MARKS)

- Code of Civil Procedure
- Indian Evidence Act
- Specific Relief Act
- Indian Stamp Act
- Himachal Pradesh Courts Act, 1976

PAPER II - CIVIL LAW II

(200 MARKS)

- Indian Contract Act
- Hindu Law
- Indian Limitation Act
- Transfer of Property Act
- H.P. Urban Rent Control Act.

PAPER III - CRIMINAL LAW

(200 MARKS)

- Indian Penal Code
- Criminal Procedure Code
- Chapter — XVII (sections 138 to 143) of the Negotiable Instruments Act
- H.P. Excise Act-2011 as Applicable to the State of H.P.
- Wild Life Protection Act
- Indian Forest Act.

PAPER IV - ENGLISH COMPOSITION

(150 MARKS)

A Choice from three Essays on General Subjects.

- ESSAY: 100 Marks
- Translation of Hindi Passage into English: 50 Marks

PAPER V - LANGUAGE

(100 MARKS)

Hindi (in Devnagri Script); no books prescribed. The paper of Hindi will comprise of the following:

- Translation of English passage into Hindi (30 marks)
- Essay in Hindi on any topic out of three (50 marks)
- Composition (idioms and corrections etc.) (20 marks)

PHASE 3 - INTERVIEW

(150 MARKS)

Candidate is required to have atleast 45% of the marks allocated for Interview.

OTHER INFORMATION

1. 40% Minimum qualifying marks in each mains paper is must except Hindi.
2. In Hindi (Paper V) 33% minimum qualifying marks.
3. Aggregate 45% in all papers for Mains is must to qualify for interview.
